STEP 1

TRAIN YOUR LISTENING

Able to differentiate the tones and phonetics is the first **key step**.

STEP 3

LEARN COMMON VOCABS

You need to have basic vocab list for you to form simple sentences. Making sentences is like building a house, what do you need? **Bricks**, the fundamental material. Same goes to vocabs.

STEP 5

MAKE CORRECT SENTENCES

Most of the people would make incorrect sentence structure when they speak. Because people direct translate from English or Malay to Mandarin. I have **special formula** in my program that you can use to fit all situation.

STEP 2

MASTER THE PINYIN

Different tones for the same word meaning is totally DIFFERENT. Mandarin is a major **tone-based language.**

STEP 4

MASTER THE GRAMMAR



STEP 6


ROLE PLAY IN DIFFERENT SCENARIOS

TOP 5 MISTAKES

✓ Learned The Wrong Tones & Phonetics.

Quite a number of people try to learn themselves, it is good to have initiative, however picking the wrong pronunciation will form a habit, which makes learning the right pronunciation even harder. Those who learn from 0 knowledge are always easier and faster.

Learned From Taiwan Or China Syllabus.

Actually some of the words used in syllabus like HSK, are not used among Malaysian Chinese. And we never pronounce any word with –r sound. Yes, we don't say that. Also, some sentences sound weird to China people but they're perfectly fine and resonate with locals. The same concept goes to Indonesia vs Malaysia Malay language.

✓ Learned From Non-native Speakers.

Sometimes, the tones or phonetics might be not so correct when we heard them. And their accent mostly learned China accent. Also, the local Chinese thinking and culture lessons are not available. The Chinese mindset is important to truly communicate with locals.

TOP 5 MISTAKES

✓ Make The Wrong Sentence Structure.

Students always direct translate from English or Bahasa Melayu into Mandarin. The sentence structure for English and Bahasa are not applicable in Mandarin. Mandarin has different sentence structure. For example,

English: I go to school tomorrow 9am

Wrong sentence:wǒ qù xuéxiào míng tiān zǎoshang 9 diǎn **Right sentence**: wǒ míng tiān zǎoshang 9 diǎn qù xuéxiào

Speak Incorrect Tones.

For the same word, it can mean different when pronounced with different tones. For example, jiù diàn = 9 o'clock jiù diàn = Hotel cǎo ní mǎ = Alpaca cāo nǐ mā = F* your mother
